- > Space in courses is limited, and courses are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Please do not delay in returning your form (e.g., 100+received within 24 hours after Selection Sheets posted). Earlier submission improves chances to get chosen courses. Preference to 11th-12th graders in meeting necessary credits.
- ➤ Courses will be filled to scheduled capacity; those with insufficient enrollment will be dropped. Affected schedules are adjusted to next choice for that day/period. Note: Athletes on teams will not be scheduled for alternative P.E. electives that are reserved for non-team students needing P.E. credits.
- ➤ <u>High School Students, esp. Juniors and Seniors</u>: To determine what courses you need to graduate on time, see the Graduation Checklist reviewed during your College & Career consultations. Tips on reading the Enrichment Elective WAAG:

- Abbreviations: MS=Middle School (6th-8th); HS = High School (9th 12th), FA=Fine Art, LOTE=Language other than English, TECH=Computer/Technology, PP=FA Private Pay, CCB=Christian Character-Building, .
- Teacher/Instructor Name is followed by the Room Assignment in the parentheses of each course listing. Courses in GREEN are two-days.
- The type of graduation credit appears 1st (see abbreviations on each page) followed by the course title, days offered, instructor name and room assignment.
- Course surcharges ("*" on the schedule):
 - A few courses are taught by independent contractor adjunct instructors (e.g., all Dance, Percussion) who charge higher rates (than for other courses) for which a surcharge is due to break even in those courses.
 - Other surcharges apply for special classes (e.g., Pottery-self-curing Trinity Industries clay; Cooking-ingredient instructor reimbursement e.g. \$25; Praise/Worship Teams \$10/wk; special art classes; after school instruction or clubs such as Karate Day 2, e.g. \$5/wk)
- FA Private Pay ("PP"): FA Private music lessons (electives & after school) and after school private Tutoring* are paid directly to the teacher--typically \$25/session.

REQUIRED COURSES:

"Type Right" Keyboarding Skills: MS/HS students who have not already had this course at PCCS. SOAR Study Skills: Required for MS students who have not yet had this course and by referral for those students needing extra assistance with organizing and getting work done.

SPECIAL SERVICES, BY REFERRAL ONLY:

All grades, Tutoring*: Students struggling w/ a core subject may enroll subject to approval; limit 2. Tutoring* surcharges are billed lump sum by the semester: FALL Semester - \$180 for those in groups of 2 or more and \$360 for one-on-one.

PRIVATE MUSIC LESSONS: Rather than drive to a different venue for music lessons, PCCS offers these on campus. MPORTANT: There are two lessons per period (25 minutes each) which are billed at \$25 paid directly and TIMELY to the instructor.

>Private Beginner, Intermediate, or Advanced Piano Lessons* XXX offers all levels of piano instruction for all ages. She lives in Forney, graduated from University of Rochester and did post-graduate studies in music and piano at SMU. She and her husband live in Forney where she has a studio and her own You Tube performance channel. She also teaches at RW School of Music. Her preferred curriculum is Faber for beginners. All days, all grades, all levels.

> Private Voice, Guitar, or Piano Lessons* XXX offers a variety of music instruction including voice, piano, guitar; she holds a Masters in Music from SMU and years of experience teaching music, including vocal instruction since 2005. See Mondays only.

<u>>Private Drum or Guitar/Bass Lessons:</u> XXX continues as a PCCS music instructor; he is a professional career musician who also teaches youth drum and guitar/bass (in fact, his son is a virtuoso musician who has played at the Meyerson many times) on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays 7th − 9th plus 10th (after school) periods.

REGULAR ENRICHMENT COURSES (alphabetically):

CCB Christian Character Trait of the Week Students learn verses and do creative activities to match the posted Christian Character Trait of the Week.

<u>CCB Outreach Missions</u> Letters and pictures are prepared (and gathered from others) by students for Teachers of the week and shut-ns and nursing home residents.

<u>CCB Christian Character Trait of the Week</u> Following the CCT of the Week (see Flash News and News on Sycamore), students do Bible-based activities and explore the verse of the week.

CCB True U: Is the Bible Reliable? NEWI Explore common and often difficult questions in this roundtable weekly discussion group.

<u>Chess NEW!</u> Join whether you're a beginner or advanced player to learn strategies, enhance your analytical skills, and compete.

<u>College & Career</u> Embedded in Friday core courses. In this graduation-requirement 10th and up students learn about college types and tuition, financial options for college costs/FAFSA, aptitudes, majors and degree plans, CTE/Vo-tech, and other exploration projects for post-graduation planning. <u>COMM Speech & Communication</u> A required course to graduate and covers the various ways in which we communicate and various speech formats. Meets .25 HS COMM Speech credit.

<u>CTE Intro to Engineering: Statics NEW!</u> Join former engineer, Mr. XXX, to learn about this amazing multi-faceted STEM career starting with the study of forces and moments of objects at rest including practical applications such as the study of trusses and load bearing beams in the new Pioneer Activities Center or the design of concrete piers that support building structures.

Exam Prep (Math or English, TSI/ACT/SAT) Practice the skills needed for college entrance exams; 10th graders and up; *meets HS graduation requirement*)

Events Planning Students assist the PCCS Events Mgr w/ planning, organizing, setup and closedown of school events

FA Figurative Sculpture I NEWI Join professional artist and new adjunct instructor, XXXh, to create a portrait in clay; students will work on only 1-2 projects this semester to gain skill in facial proportions, anatomy, and experience a true art form; creativity is exciting and is explored! Meets .25 HS FA credit.

Materials surcharge \$25 + Independent Contractor Fee \$10

FA Creation Station NEW! Students use everyday materials with supervision but no directions to imagine and create amazing and interesting projects.

FA Draw & Write NEW! Using a curriculum of the same title, students engage in guided drawings, to illustrate simple stories.

FA Drawing I NEW! In this new art class, join adjunct instructor and professional artist, XXX, to learn how to "see" an object and translate it into a 2-dimensional drawing, practice looking for shadows, reflected light and highlights, learn shading, focal points, and how to make your art interesting and unique. Meets .25 HS FA credit.

FA Comedy Theatre—Cast only this semester NEW! PCCS is known for its "out-of-the-box creative" theatre program—this semester we prepare for yet another fun comedy production – Role audition during 1st class; this class involves some Friday after school practices plus after school rehearsals two weeks prior to Spring Performances; \$25 costume fee if costume provided by PCCS.

FA Patchwork NEW! Join adjunct instructor and professional artist, XXX, as she teaches the art of fabric, including how to use a sewing machine, design, cut, and hand quilt unique creations Materials surcharge \$25 + Independent Contractor Fee \$10

FA Gospel Songs/Gospel Ensemble Join vocalists XXX to learn, practice, and perform at Chapels and other performances.

FA Gospel Team – MIDDLE SCHOOL (Formal Practice Period)NEW! Join NEW! Join Students with vocal and instrumental talent practice together with vocalist XXX to prepare for Chapels and other performances.

FA Praise Band – HIGH SCHOOL Team (Formal Practice Period) The team uses this Friday before school session to prepare for Chapels and other performances. Meets .5 HS FA credit.

FA Sheep to Shawl A favorite returns! Join adjunct instructor and professional artist, XXX, as she continues this neat elective where students learn to take a completely raw, straight off the sheep, fleece and turn it into fabulous yarn to hand-dye. Then they learn crochet, knit or weaving skills. They will card and spin wool with a spinning sheet and a drop spindle and turn store bought yard into exciting colors or creations. <u>Health I HS</u> students need Health I and II to graduate; meets Graduation Checklist requirement. Don't put off this important and informative required graduation credit!

HONORS Aviation Ground School – Module 1 NEW! A fantastic opportunity to work toward your Private Pilot's License by having methodical ground school guidance and training with XXX, retired United States Air Force certified in numerous aviation areas including FAA Control Tower Operator, Limited Weather Observation, Air Traffic Controller holding an A.A. degree in Airway Science, a B.S. in Professional Aeronautics, and a Masters degree in progress in Aeronautical Science. Start your path to becoming a Private Pilot!!

HONORS ENG – Selections from Austen NEW! Join XXX, veteran English college professor and high school faculty, to read and explore two selections from author Jane Austen, one of the premier English novelists. These include Emma, widely considered to be her greatest novel, and Persuasion, the last complete novel; NOTE: Honors classes require more prep time outside of class; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade!

HONORS SCIENCE – Intro to Engineering - Statics NEW! Get Honors credit for this STEM class while learning and exploring introductory principles of engineering, starting with Statics—the study of the forces responsible for maintaining balance and causing motion of bodies, or changes in their shapes (just think about the trusses and load-beaning beams or the concrete piers supporting the entire structure of the new Pioneer Activities Building; no calculus involved in this intro course; 3-5 hours of preparation outside of class to gain this weighted grade; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade.

HONORS TECH Yearbook Join Mrs. XXX, our Tech & Media Specialist (and veteran Yearbook Instructor) to produce a polished and competition-worthy Yearbook; choose either or both class periods to complete assigned pages; students from last semester have enrollment priority and use computer skills, digital photography, and personal creativity using an online app; requires at least two hours outside class time per week to meet deadlines and gain Honors credit; must have 80%+ average to gain credit; weighted grade; meets .25 HS COMP credit.

Skills for Life – Elementary NEW! Learn everything from how to iron a shirt, address an envelope, cook a steak, and more...skills that many students just don't know and need!

<u>Math Games NEW!</u> Students pick numbers, add, subtract, etc. to solve math mysteries along with fun activities and games.

Money Management for Teens, Dave Ramsey As a requirement to graduate, teens learn about budgeting, personal finance, interest, taxes, credit cards, and fiscal management. Meets Graduation Credit for Money Mgt/Consumer Math; offered each semester.

PE Archery XXX continues as instructor to teach archery skills, safety, and competition skills for the team class under the guidelines of our school's membership in the National Archery in Schools Program (NASP); school-owned bows are available or students may inquire as to what bow may be used after the first day of class; Meets .25 HS P.E. credit.

<u>PE Boys'/Girls' JH, JV and Varsity Team Athletics</u> Players work on skills first until the formal season begins (Volleyball-August; Basketball-November; Baseball/Softball-Feb/March as per league rules) w/ after-school practices required at that time. For basketball team, the class is required in during the Fall & FALL semesters (no new mid-term students may join after the season is in full swing or after any league

cutoff dates). Those interested in only Varsity Baseball or Softball should select the 7th period P.E. class for that sport; Game schedules are posted on Sycamore, right sidebar, and on the CALENDAR tab; meets .5 HS PE credit. Athletic Team-based Fees: \$200 Varsity, \$150 JV, \$100 MS NEW! PAID THROUGH THE SYCAMORE PAYMENT SYSTEM.

PE Cheer Team – Elementary (Star Squad), Upper (Spirit Squad)* Performances occur at the Pep Rallies and selected games; practice sessions to improve tumbling, cheer, consistency, and creativity; moved to after school due to the new Co-ed Sports Teams in 7th period. Athletic Team-based Fee: \$150 NEW! PAID THROUGH THE SYCAMORE PAYMENT SYSTEM (includes practice shirt, bow, bag plus rental of uniforms and pom poms); parents responsible for white socks/shoes as per the Cheer Bylaws. PE Dance – FAITH BLAZERS A favorite returns with dance teacher, Mrs. XXX, as she teaches dance and collaborates with students on choreography to Christian music for performances and a recital. Meets .25 HS FA or PE credit. Surcharge for unless parents purchase dance uniform/shirt directly.

<u>PE Fitness Fun</u> Guided physical fitness and game activities with body movement offers students a way to expel extra energy as well as improve gross motor skills and self-control!

PE Golf Skills & Team Play NEW! Beginners and avid golfers are encouraged to join this class to build our golf program! Join Mr. XXX to practice skills and team play; students with more advanced skills may be scheduled for Friday after school practices for competition prep; some days students may be scheduled to leave for Golf Course at beginning of 9th period TBD.

PE Karate – Christian Soldiers, White to Black Belts* Choose the belt class that matches the student's belt level at the start of a semester (e.g., white belt = beginners). This nationally recognized program requires Bible memory & Christian character for belt testing; CS karate uniform required. After-school sessions required for GOLD BELTS AND HIGHER to adequately prepare for belt testing; a semester instructor pass-thru surcharge of \$5/week billed by the semester; for those students who Belt Test, the CS Belt Testing fee is \$35.

PCCS Scouting for Guys and Girls, All Grades* NEW! This program's charter is RESTRICTED to PCCS enrolled students only, and for guys or gals of all ages. What do they learn and experience? Everything from wilderness survival, first aid, navigation, knot craft, citizenship, healthy living, fitness, sciences, trades, business, and service while improving team building, personal mgt., leadership, and confidence. This amazing, fun, industrious, adventurous, and creative learning and goal setting program is offered thru veteran scout leaders, Mrs. XXX and Mrs. XXX. So, don't let what you hear about scouting outside of PCCS deter you from choosing this rewarding program here at PCCS! A monthly scout meeting is required after school, as well as several fun activities and events like camp! There is a required parent meeting after the semester starts to learn more. This year there is an incentive to get involved--only a \$25 annual registration fee with the national organization which including yearly membership and Scout Magazine). Student-purchased scout shirt is required (try eBay or Facebook scouting uniform exchange groups); PCCS provides Scouting Handbooks. PAN Julie Cato or Becky Boccaccio, the PCCS Scouting Coordinators, if you can be a parent helper (gain Partnership hours!). Senior Work Study By request, this was added last semester for 12th graders to gain work experience and some savings and use an afternoon slot to complete a Senior Work Study; preapproval by HS Advisor if Grad Credits met, entrance exams completed, and Honor Roll GPA; pick 1 day. Study Hall-Proctored Must work on homework or quietly read to remain in class: four school computers are available in the Lewis Room where this is scheduled; responsible use of laptops may be permitted on a case-by-case basis (see school's Internet Policy--including no instant messaging or recreational media); sleeping or not staying academically busy will result in referral to the campus cleanup team. TECH Canva 101 NEW! Students learn how to create digital media using the Canva app for flyers. documents, social media posts including Instagram, and promotions; taught by the PCCS Tech & Media Specialist, XXX, .25 HS TECH credit.

TECH Excel at EXCEL NEW! Students learn an important career and college skill with this technology class focused on the the basics and functions of the Microsoft Excel application, .25 HS TECH credit. TECH Fundamentals of Graphic Design I NEW! Students will become efficient in utilizing color, font, graphics, images, spatial layouts, themes, and how to engage your audience with effective and eyepleasing designs.

TECH Minecraft Teaming Only serious focused students need apply; teams will work together to meet objectives each week established by the instructor.

TECH TechnoJournal NEW! Students in $3^{rd} - 4^{th} - 5^{th}$ write personal journals with creative touches about events, favorite things, and musings to improve reflective thinking, writing skills, and produce appealing eye-catching booklets using the Microsoft Word skills in this fun TechnoKids computer abd writing skills curriculum.

TECH TechnoMe Students learn beginning technology skills using a curriculum by the same title. They use a Google Slides or PowerPoint template to create a mini-biography, designing a slide show about fun facts, goals, and likes. They can even insert additional About Me slides to build a family tree, puzzle, or venn diagram.
